As a leader in faith community nursing (FCN) education, consultation, and research for over 30 years, the Westberg Institute serves health ministry programs worldwide. Its mission is to promote the development of high-quality outcomes-based FCN practice as part of an overall health ministry program.

- They host the annual **Westberg Symposium** in spring.

- WI developed and provides the electronic platform *Yammer*, a Microsoft based networking website that is accessible from any computer, tablet, or smartphone. Currently, there are more than 1,100 FCNs using the site to discuss health topics ranging from diabetes to heart disease and everything in between. Over 70 groups focusing on denomination, location, or general interest topics have been formed since its launch. There is no cost to participant but you must register. - They have authored and maintain the Faith Community Nursing Foundation's Course for FCNs. This
