Stop the Bleed (Bleeding Control Basics)

What everyone should know about bleeding emergencies – from home or work injuries to vehicular crashes to gun/bomb attacks – be prepared! The help given by an immediate responder can often make the difference between life and death, even before professional rescuers arrive. The focus of this program is on: the immediate response to bleeding, recognition of life-threatening bleeding, and appropriate ways to stop bleeding. The session will include hands-on practice with applying various tourniquets and wound packing. Anyone with a medical license or certification or a student working towards a degree in a clinical healthcare field can become an instructor after attending this course.
