# AVERAGE & INTERPRET BP RESULTS

How do clinicians report SMBP results?	<ul> <li>Take average of all SMBP measurements reported from patient         <ul> <li>BP Average Calculator   American Medical Association (ama-assn.org)</li> </ul> </li> <li>Document average for systolic and diastolic BP</li> <li>3 days (12 readings) are minimum for making clinical decisions from SMBP results</li> </ul>
Where will SMBP data be documented?	<ul> <li>□ Direct to EHR from Home BP Monitor</li> <li>□ Manually document in EHR</li> <li>□ Population Health Management system</li> <li>□ Spreadsheet</li> <li>□ Vendor Portal</li> <li>□ Other</li> </ul>
